Introduction

SAVERA is a Non-Governmental Organization, was founded on September 23, 2000 with a few likeminded enthusiastic and committed personalities from various walks of life including academician, journalists, social activists with main objective to promote holistic development of the marginalized and vulnerable communities, particularly those who stayed behind, neglected, exploited and unable to educate themselves in the rural areas of Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Jharkhand, West Bengal, Odisha, Delhi and Himachal Pradesh.

SAVERA is registered under Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 from GNCT of Delhi with all India Level and also registered under Section 12AA & 80G of Income Tax Act from Govt. of India.

SAVERA believes that improvement of under-developed and under-privileged rural communities is largely related with augmenting the capability of vulnerable groups of rural society like women, scheduled caste/tribes, poor students and other marginal groups. Knowing the fact that most of these groups are uneducated, unaware of their legal and constitutional rights and are living in the most destitute conditions, we had to focus on two resolutions (i) educating of rural people about their social, economic and political rights and (ii) bringing positive and long changes in the lives of rural people through implementing various socio-economic welfare programmes.

In past 22 years, SAVERA is involved in various types of educational and awareness programs, socio-economic welfare programs and also imparting new ideas through

knowledge based empirical research, surveys & innovation on various socio-economic issues. SAVERA is primarily working in the field of Health & Family Welfare, Consumer Protection and Consumer Welfare, Micro finance (SHGs), Housing and Poverty Alleviation, Livelihood Programme, Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Environment & Sustainable Development.

Being a grassroot level organisation and having vast experience in implementation of various Government and CSR projects, SAVERA works in close collaboration with Central and State Govt. departments at different level and also involved in CSR Schemes of several PSUs like REC, NTPC, GAIL, HPCL, ONGC, BPCL, Ujjivan Small Finance Bank Limited etc. The organization is actively involved in area of regeneration of traditional industries through various approaches for its sustainable development and create sustainable livelihood.

Objectives

The broad objectives of SAVERA is to enable the under privileged population of the society especially in Rural Area to attain in self-reliance in their social and economic development and to create awareness and empower. SAVERA's social mission is to achieve the social empowerment for overall development of the society.

Social justice and empowerment and capacity building have been promoted all among the underprivileged sections of society. SFURTI Scheme: Jute & Banana Natural Fiber Cluster Purnea

In aspirational district Purnea, SAVERA as an implementing agency working with Ministry of MSME, Government of India for the development of Jute and Banana Fiber Cluster under the Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Agencies (SFURTI). The Common Facility Center for the same has been established at Uphrali, Purnea. There are 1000 artisans associated with this cluster. This project under SFURTI has sanctioned to SAVERA on 15th July, 2020 to develop Jute and Banana Natural Fiber Cluster Purne for five years.

SFURTI is Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries. Ministry of Micro Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME), Govt. of India has launched this scheme in the year 2005 with the view to promote Cluster development. The scheme



of Ministry of MSME, Government of India envisages development of clusters to:


- (i) provide employment to artisans and entrepreneurs,

Safe Drinking Water Phase I : Installation of 200 RO Plant in Anganwadi Centre

The REC, under its CSR activities has sanctioned financial contribution of 1.01 crore for installation of 200 RO water treatment plant with 500-liter overhead storage tank and 1 HP Electrical Pump at 200 Anganwadi Centres/Primary Schools in Purnea district of Bihar to implementing agency Society for Advancement of Villagers Empowerment and Rehabilitation of All (SAVERA) to implement within 18 months in two phases from the date of sanction. The project was sanctioned on 28th February, 2020. Due to COVID19 project got delayed in implementation as project started on 18th October, 2020. Under the first phase 100 RO plants are being installed at Anganwadi Centres in Purnea district.

Objective Of the Project

1. To improve access to safe drinking water for children
2. To focus or raising awareness and changing behavior around WASH (water, sanitation and Hygiene) related issue among children.
3. To facilitate capacity building of staff of Anganwadi Kendra/ Primary schools



Awareness and Training Programmes on Safe Drinking Water


Under the project Training for Anganwadi Sevika and other stakeholders were conducted at village level. IEC materials were distributed individually to Sevika, Staffs and panchayat members at the time of installation of RO machine at Anganwadi Centres.

IEC Booklet & Pamphlet

Information, education and communication (IEC) is also important part to execute the project therefore SAVERA have prepared IEC booklet and Pamphlet on Hygiene and Safe Drinking Water in Hindi language aims at behavior change of the masses to adopt better sanitation practices.

Sevika were enquired by PMR team about what input they got from IEC materials.

Sevika and Panchayat members revealed that IEC materials consist of booklet and pamphlet are very useful for them to understand the importance of cleanliness. IEC booklet gives immense knowledge to them that how to keep surroundings clean and its significance for health. At the time of installation of RO Machine, a representative of company disseminated detail knowledge about each and every aspect of functioning of RO machine to Anganwadi Sevika who has taken



responsibility of look after RO plant. It was found that all of them have become well trained to handle the machine effectively. They have kept machine clean and protected. Somewhere there is problem of space and lack of pucca house for centre so machine is fixed inside adjoined house of Sevika.

Awareness Campaign
Distribution of IEC Materials on Cleanliness and Safe Drinking Water



Installation of RO Treatment plant at 100 Aanganwadi Centre has ensured safe drinking water to 4000 children. There is average 40 children registered with each centre. These are malnourished children required to be taken care with all aspect of hygiene and cleanliness. It was observed that these centres were highly in need to access of safe drinking water. As per the various reports it has stated that of ground water of Purnea district is itself highly contaminated. Drinking water in many blocks of the district is not drinkable due high level of arsenic and other contaminated elements.

Helping Hand of Needy People in COVID19 Pandemic

The countrywide lockdown is being eased in stages but there are all too many people out there who need help. SAVERA self-organized a fightback campaign against Corona, tried to create a collective, sustainable social response to the pandemic by mobilising volunteers and coordinating the delivery of food and medicines to the needy, especially the elderly and daily wagers.

SAVERA took initiative with Society and volunteers to take care of needy people of different section in pandemic situation. Karigar COVID Squads are formed after making them aware about vaccination drive and COVID safety measures. These squads are working since last one month to get vaccinated eligible artisans. Awareness regarding safety measures of COVID been disseminated by squads among the artisans. Karigar COVID Squads reached out to around 2000 artisans.
